

It is important to know that NEASC will not give us a full five years to address every recommendation. They will prioritize recommendations into several categories. The first group, usually those related to the health and safety of students and teachers, will need to be addressed within 12 months. The next tier of recommendations will need to be addressed within 24 months and then the remaining recommendations will have to be attended to by the 5th anniversary of the visit. When schools/systems do not respond in a timely manner to NEASC's recommendations then the Commission on Public Secondary Schools (of NEASC) starts to take adverse actions against a school. The progression usually goes from 1. Fully Accredited to 2. School on Warning to 3. School on Probation, and finally to 4. Termination of Accreditation.
